Course Description

Not since the production of the film *The Last Temptation of Christ* in 1988 has a work of fiction caused as much uproar in the Christian community as has Dan Brown's *The DaVinci Code*. Even so, people seem to be enthralled by this 2003 novel that has been on the best selling list for ninety-two weeks (as of 12/29/04). The film, directed by Ron Howard, is currently in production and due to be released in 2006. More than a dozen books have been written that either discredit or support the information Brown presents to his readers. ABC produced a special program on *The DaVinci Code* focusing on the alleged marriage of Jesus and Mary Magdalene.

After a thorough reading and discussion of the novel, this course will seek to expose students to the cause of the uproar and help them critically investigate allegations made both by and about Brown and his book. Students will go from the halls of the Louvre to the halls of the Vatican as they study such topics as Mary Magdalene and the role of women in the early Church, the Opus Dei, the Priory of Sion, the Knight Templars, the Holy Grail, the humanity versus the divinity of Christ, Gnostic writings, the Council of Nicea, and Leonardo DaVinci.

Because of the diversity of information that will be presented in this course, guest lecturers will assist in our quest. Tentative lecturers are: Dr. Arne Flaten, an art historian and Professor at Coastal Carolina University will speak to the class on Leonardo DaVinci and the *Last Supper* painting. Dr. Eliza Glaze, History Professor at Coastal Carolina University will lecture on women and the role of women. Dr. Roy Moye, English Professor of at Coastal Carolina University will make a presentation on the Grail legends. (Guest lecturers will be videotaped to be shown at U.S.C.)

Brown said during an interview, "My hope in writing this novel was that the story would serve as a catalyst and a springboard for people to discuss the important topics of faith, religion, and history." Indeed it has.

Course Objectives

Although our main objective is to analyze religious information presented in *The DaVinci Code*, there are several other objectives that naturally flow from this:

- 1. To analyze data, and to reach and form opinions, about religious matters based upon reliable research:
- 2. To develop an awareness of the problems involved in obtaining reliable sources when doing religious studies research; and,
- 3. To form an educated opinion about the use of religion in fiction.

Course Oddities and Requirements

- 1. Everyone who had registered for the course in the fall was emailed and asked to read the novel during the semester break if they had not already read it. (If you did not receive this email, please correct your email address on blackboard). If you registered late and have not yet read the book, don't worry, you will read it during the semester...but you probably won't be able to put it down once you start it until you've finished!
- 2. Everyone begins this class with an A (100 pts). Failure to attend class or to complete your assignments on time will result in the following subtractions from your grade:

 Failure to hand in an assignment on time = -2pts.; Failure to hand in an assignment = -5 pts.

- 3. Because we meet only once a week, class attendance is mandatory. There are no excused absences and any absences will affect your grade in the following manner: the first absence = -5 pts; the second absence = -15 pts.; the third absence = -40 pts.(no better than a D for the course); the fourth absence = -50 pts. (an F for the final course grade). Should you be hospitalized, or severely ill, you will be required to complete an extra assignment to make up for your absence. You are also responsible for obtaining any notes, etc. that you missed.
- 4. You must use the Discussion Board on Blackboard at least 10 out of the 15 weeks of class. For each of the 10 weeks you do not use it, you will receive –1 pt.
- 5. Depending upon the number of students in the class, you will be expected to research one item for discussion, probably every 2 weeks. Some items to be researched are merely definitions and will require little time, others are more complicated and will require more time. We will divide these items up in an equitable manner, and hopefully in a way that will help you in your other studies.
 - Please note that your research item should contain how it is used in *The DaVinci Code*. You will compile what you have discovered in written form to be submitted to the Instructor no later than the day before the next class. You will be expected to present what you have researched to the class and the Instructor will post your information on WebCt. If you have a problem with public speaking/presentations, please notify the Instructor in advance.
- 6. There are no tests or papers for this course. It is assumed that because you have registered for this course you already have a thirst for knowledge, a desire for truth, and are thereby motivated to study and learn. You are expected to do all of the assignments, to think theologically, and to contribute to the class.
- 7. There will be a final exam that will assess your ability to reach a conclusion about what you have learned. You will be allowed to use the novel and your class notes.

Because this is the first time this class has been taught, there may need to be adjustments made to the syllabus and the Instructor reserves the right to do so when it is believed it will be beneficial to you. Any suggestions you have to improve the class are welcomed.
